

Commissioners of Mardela Springs Town Meeting – February 20, 2018

Attendance: Stanford Robinson, Mike Murphy, Mary Bailey and Debra Bailey

The meeting is called to order with the pledge to the flag.

Debbie motions to dispense with the reading of the minutes, Mary seconds. Passed.

Kortney reads Mr. David Insley's letter of resignation.

Mr. Dallas Baker is asked to come forward to discuss the protocol when it comes to snow plowing. He has provided a map of the plowing "zones," which shows the area that the driver is designated to. He also provides their list of drivers with contact information. He tells the Commissioners and Mr. VanMeter to contact him directly on his cell phone the next time there is any issue at all. When asked about the street sweeping he says that they committed to coming once a year and they will follow that. He also offered to help with attaining and transport a crew of inmates to help with the Spring street sweeping that the Town handles. The County also asks for the town to keep in mind that they are looking for an available property for a recycling station.

In regards to 214 Bridge Street, the lady living there had been instructed to move out by February 1st. Mr. VanMeter has not seen physical evidence of whether she has or not.

The federal grant process through Mr. Lackie has been delayed 2 to three weeks, but he will be getting back to us in late February.

We are waiting to the survey of the playground to come back.

The Court put a hold on the orders for 405 and 407 Bridge Street until February 10th. They have not been signed by a Judge yet.

A tentative schedule has been made for the Boat Ramp Renovations meetings with a deadline for the bids to be in by April 25th and opening of the bids on May 18th. This needs to be advertised 30 days in advance.

Kortney forwards the information provided by Mr. Kilmer about placemaking grants to the Commissioners.

Kortney requests a procedure to follow in regards to solar panels being installed within town limits. Debbie is going to check in with Doug Gosnell because Sharptown has just put something in place about this.

Mike has requested the mulching of the playground. We are on the list.

Mike also has arranged everything for our 3rd Annual Spring Cleanup on April 28th.

Mr. VanMeter has contacted the Daily Times multiple times about littering the town with their papers that nobody has requested and also leaving them at vacant properties. The Commissioneers request that he follow up and file whatever complaint is necessary to make it stop.

An Ordinance Work Session was scheduled for March 13, 2018, but Debbie requests that it be postponed due to the pending birth of her grandbaby.

There being no further business, Debbie made a motion to adjourn, Mary seconded, passed.
