

## Commissioners of Mardela Springs Town Meeting – August 21, 2018

Attendance: Stanford Robinson, Mary Bailey, Mike Murphy, Debbie Bailey, and Angie Drehmer

The meeting is called to order with the pledge to the flag.

Debbie motions to dispense with the reading of the minutes, Mary seconds. Passed.

Police report that there was a burglary at Mardela Middle and High School and a lawn mower was stolen.

Kortney makes the Commissioners aware that she has received the SHA application and will be mailing it in after getting Stanford's signature tonight.

There is no news to report for Community Development Block Grant other than the application has been turned in.

The Playground Grant application has also been submitted and is waiting for approval.

There was a pre-construction meeting last week for the Boat Ramp Renovations and it has been decided to push the closure to mid-November instead of September to allow more people to enjoy the warm weather.

Mr. VanMeter has put safety signs up at the end of Fire Protection Road, and DNR has reviewed the situation. Mr. Emery thanks the Commissioners for moving the bench rather than removing.

After being asked by a towns person, the Commissioners report that there is no town curfew and if a noise is disturbing the peace then the police should be called.

Mary Bailey reports on an incident of a car parked on Main Street, and states that there needs to be a sign between Branch and Bratten. The Commissioners will look closer into what the ordinances state.

It is reported that there are people riding golf carts on the road in town. This is not a matter for the Commissioners to police, and if they are concerned for anyone's safety they should contact appropriate authorities.

Debbie brings up that the Town needs to purchase 11 new snowflakes to replace the ancient Christmas trees and she will be calling the vendor to see if there is a price break for that many.

An Ordinance Work Session was not scheduled.

There being no further business, Debbie made a motion to adjourn, Mary seconded, passed.
