

Commissioners of Mardela Springs Town Meeting – September 18, 2018

Attendance: Stanford Robinson, Mary Bailey, Mike Murphy, Debbie Bailey, and Angie Drehmer

The meeting is called to order with the pledge to the flag.

Debbie motions to dispense with the reading of the minutes, Mary seconds. Passed.

No Police Report

There is no update to report in regards to the Community Development Block Grant.

There is no update to report in regards to the Playground Grant.

The boat ramp renovations start date has been pushed back to November 15th to give the community more time to enjoy the warm weather before closing for approximately three months.

Mack Malone comes forward to discuss with the Commissioners his hopes of purchasing the Wesleyan Church in town in order to use it as a venue for small weddings, showers, etc. The Commissioners approve his proposed uses of the property, motioned by Mary and seconded by Debbie.

A community member informs the public that if they would like to report suspicious activity related to the Pokemon Go game, there is a phone number on the website and they will remove the Pokemon.

Delmarva Power is changing the lights gradually and per priority order related to the darkness of the area.

Shirley Bailey thanks the Commissioners for all their hard work and the changes they are making. She also proposes adding an expiration date to the Building Permit Ordinance.

Paul Adams brings up the problematic parking of a car on one side of Main Street which causes a school bus to pass into oncoming traffic. The Commissioners request that Mr. VanMeter put some No Parking signs up on the side of the street.

Debbie reports what appears to be an untagged vehicle on Major Bailey's property.

It is decided to place the new traffic speed sign at the end of School Street and each end of Main Street.

Mary reports that she is meeting with Lisa from DNR on October 4th to assess the condition of the bulkhead.

An Ordinance Work Session was not scheduled.

There being no further business, Debbie made a motion to adjourn, Mary seconded, passed.
